



Draft National Framework for Children and Young People's Continuing Care

The Department of Health is seeking views on the revised National Framework for Children and Young People's Continuing Care (including a tool to ensure all relevant needs are assessed and support decisions about care). The framework helps clinical commissioning groups and other professionals to assess the care required for children and young people with health needs that are not met by existing or specialised services. The 2010 framework has been revised to take account of changes to commissioning and the new arrangements for children with special educational needs and disability. <u>CARERS</u>

Carer's Credit

In August, The Department for Work and Pensions announced that less than 5% of

those who are eligible for Carer's Credit have signed up for the credit. This credit adds value to an individual's national insurance contributions, and can result in an increase of their state pension of up to £200 per year. The credit is designed for those who are caring for others for 20 hours or more per week and do not qualify for Carer's Allowance

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

Smoking in Prisons

The Department of Justice intends to implement a full smoke free policy in all prisons in Wales from January 2016 and at 4 early adopter sites in England (HMPs Exeter, Channings Wood, Dartmoor and Erlestoke) from March 2016.

Youth Justice Review

The government has announced a review of the youth justice system. The review will:

- look at the evidence and current practice in preventing youth crime and rehabilitating young offender
- explore how the youth justice system can most effectively interact with wider services for children and young people
- consider whether the current

arrangements are fit for purpose

Prison Education Review

The government has commissioned a review of prison education to examine how it supports rehabilitation of different types of prison learners. The review has been established to examine:

- scope, quality and effectiveness of current education provision in prisons and Young Offender Institutions (YOIs) holding young adults. In particular the review will consider how provision supports learner progression and the successful rehabilitation of different segments of prison learners;
- domestic and international evidence of what works well in prison education which demonstrably supports rehabilitation of different segments of prison learners
- options for future models of education services in prisons which emphasise effective rehabilitation of different segments of prison learners

Modern Slavery Act (2015)

The **Modern Slavery Act (2015)** (see May 2015's Big Source) came into force at the end of July. The first series of measures, focused on criminal justice provisions include:

- ensuring that those who commit these crimes are subject to the toughest possible asset recovery regime.
- introducing Slavery and Trafficking Reparation orders, which encourage the courts to use seized assets to compensate victims.
- the commencement of regional pilots of the National Referral Mechanism (NRM)

 the system used across Government and by various agencies to refer, protect and support victims of modern slavery.

<u>HEALTH</u>

National Guardian Consultation

In September, The **Care Quality Commission** (CQC), launched a public consultation seeking views on the new role of a **National Guardian**.

http://www.cqc.org.uk/content/give-us-yourviews-new-national-guardian-role The need for an independent National Guardian for the NHS was highlighted in Sir Robert Francis's 'Freedom to Speak Up' review in February (see February's Big Source). Among their responsibilities, the National Guardian will lead, advise, and support named individuals within NHS trusts called 'local guardians' in carrying out investigations on how concerns are being handled. They will also share good practice, report on national or common themes, and identify any barriers that are preventing the NHS from having a truly safe and open culture. The public consultation will be open until 9th December 2015.

Health and Social Care Data

Dame Caldicott has been appointed to a new role as the National Data Guardian for Health and Social Care. This role will involve working independently of government, providing guidance and challenge to it on important data issues, including

- patient confidentiality
- information sharing
- avoiding abuse of public trust in how health and care data is used

In July, the Department of Health announced that a new independent **Patient Safety Investigation Service** will be set up by April 2016. This service will use the approach used by the Air Accident Investigation Branch in the airline industry, and will be housed at Monitor/Trust Development Agency.

In order to ensure continued relevance, the Department of Health and Public Health England are consulting on the PHOF indicator set, with a view to updating from April 2016.
